

**NEW MARLBOROUGH TOWN LIBRARY TRUSTEES' MEETING
MARCH 28, 2013**

Irene called the meeting to order with Debbie, Irene, Claudette and Brian present. The minutes of the February meeting were accepted.

Debbie related that a Berkshire Museum pass worth \$100 has been out for a month. She called the person and has not gotten an answer. The trustees asked her to try again.

Debbie also reported that The Mount pass, costing \$75, will not offer free admission to pass holders. The cost of a visit to The Mount will be \$10, \$8 reduction in fee. The trustees decided to not renew the pass this year.

The Spring Egg Hunt went well with 20 children attending.

The Robotics Program was a huge success.

Debbie attended the Broadband meeting on March 13; CWMARS has chosen Crocker as a provider. We will need new cables and will wait to see how it will be paid.

Wilkinson checked the drainage problem at the library. He related that landscaping will have to be done in the spring.

The Ikebana workshops are very popular. Brian may continue them monthly, except for July.

There will be a Friends' Meeting on April 13. We will ask for a volunteer to keep track of the fundraising responses via Excel and to send thank you notes.

The Summer Reading Program has ten registrants. Debbie has arranged for the following programs: Tom Masters will do Dance through Literature (\$75); Erna Lampman will do worm boxes; Cooking with Miss Debbie, (\$250); Mosaics on stone wall and Pam Hardcastle will do some readings.

The Library Trustees decided against hanging the painting by Elizabeth Lombardi since we believe the Library should only hang items they own.

The trustees voted to purchase two computers @ \$604 from WCA. The Friends will be asked to pay for them.

A Lego Club will be held on Wednesday afternoons from 3-4 p.m. The PTA is assisting with this project. Twenty-one children have registered.

Debbie will get an estimate for a perennial garden in the memory of Mr. Tedesco, from Maria Gay. She will advise the family.

The next meeting is scheduled for April 18 at 5 p.m.
